#### An Overview

An extensive and wide-ranging collection (approx. 650 documents) relating to 20th century architecture and design.

Documents on offer include early publications from the Hochschule für Gestaltung Ulm, sales brochures, rare press kits and other promotional material (including original photographs) from leading furniture companies and designers (Vitsoe, Cassina, Artemide, Danese Milano), product manuals for home and office equipment (Olivetti, Braun), architectural monographs, Architectural Association boxed portfolios, large foldout posters relating to Ettore Sottsass and Memphis, and scarce documents and ephemera relating to Radical Architecture (Superstudio, Archizoom, Studio Alchimia). There is also a strong section on Postmodern designers (Ron Arad, Marc Newson, Shiro Kuramata), with rare monographs (some conceived as artist books) and exhibition ephemera in each instance. The collection also contains a section on artist Donald Judd, who also worked across architecture and design practices.

#### <u>Section 1. Germany</u> > HfG Ulm

The Ulm School of Design ('Hochschule für Gestaltung Ulm') was founded in 1953 by Inge Aicher-Scholl, Otl Aicher and Max Bill, and quickly gained international reputation through its progressive approaches to the design process which went beyond the Bauhaus approach of integrating art, craft and technology. Operating throughout the 1950-60s, it is regarded as one of the world's most significant design schools.

The material presented here spans the years 1958 to 1989. Among the earliest documents is an application form for the school (in its own right an elegant piece of typographic design), and issues of the respected Ulm school magazine. This section also demonstrates the expanding legacy and interest in the Ulm School, by way of Ulm exhibition catalogues at venues such as the Bauhaus-Archiv (Berlin) and the Ulmer Museum, and pieces of ephemera such as foldout posters detailing product designs of former Ulm staff members and exhibition invitation flyers.



#### Section 1. Germany > Braun and Vitsoe

German design companies Braun and Vitsoe were closely connected to the Ulm School through their wish to combine functionality and technology in industrial design. In 1956, Braun created its first design department, headed by Dr. Fritz Eichler, who collaborated with the Ulm School of Design on a new product line. In 1956 Braun introduced its famous SK4 record player designed by the young Dieter Rams and the pioneer of system design, Hans Gugelot (then lecturer of design at HfG Ulm).

Rams soon became the most influential designer at Braun and a key figure in the German design renaissance of the late 1950s and 1960s. His work was typified by an austere aesthetic but was highly user-friendly ('less but better.'). For nearly 30 years Rams served as head of design for Braun A.G. until his retirement in 1995, when he was succeeded by Peter Schneider. Many of his designs (for calculators, radios, electric razors, etc.) are in major design collections such as the Museum of Modern Art, New York.

By the 1970s, Braun had begun to focus on home consumer appliances, including coffee makers, clocks and radios. At this point Pop-art began to influence their products, which incorporated the movement's bright colours whilst retaining a simplicity of form in keeping with their functionalist philosophy. In 1981, the company's audio and hi-fi division broke off into Braun Electronic GmbH.

Dieter Rams' furniture designs were simultaneously being realised by Vitsœ company, established in 1959 by the Danish designer Niels Vitsœ and Otto Zapf. For his entire career Rams worked almost exclusively for Braun and Vitsœ.

The material ranges from 1960s-80s, consisting predominantly of promotional leaflets, advertisements and brochures for products. The extensive collection shows the trends and dominance of German products on the international post-war market.

#### <u>Section 2. Italy</u> > Part 1: Made in Italy

Italian design picked up rapidly after World War II, with a large number of newly founded companies managing to establish themselves away from Milan, Italy's economic centre. The design boom achieved wide recognition with MoMA's 1972 exhibition 'Italy - The new domestic landscape.' (see no. 62 in this section).

This section showcases a large range of material (sales brochures, catalogues, exhibition ephemera, posters, product information sheets, design monographs) from the following designers and manufacturers, representing one of the richest sections in the collection: Gavina, Danese Milano, Adolfo Natali, Cassina, Artemide, Mendini, Castiglioni, Gufram, Mari, Bellini, Poltronova, Simon, Pallucco and Olivetti.

This section contains a broad range of items related to Olivetti, the Italian manufacturer of typewriters, computers, printers and other such business products. In 1952 MoMA held an exhibition titled 'Olivetti: Design in Industry.', and many of the products are now in the museum's permanent collection. Olivetti Synthesis was the name given to their office furniture series. Both Mario Bellini and Ettore Sottsass directed Olivetti's design at various stages.

'Italy...is not only the dominant product design force in the world today but also illustrates some of the concerns of all industrial societies. Italy has assumed the characteristics of a micro-model where a wide range of possibilities, limitations and critical problems of contemporary designers throughout the world are represented by diverse and sometimes opposite approaches.' (From the MoMA 1972 exhibition press release).













#### Section 2. Italy > Part 2: Vignelli and Knoll

Massimo Vignelli was an Italian designer who worked across many areas of design (book, corporate, environmental, interior and graphics, amongst others). His work for Knoll is well documented in the collection, and provides a striking example of the effectiveness of simple graphics, perhaps best encapsulated in his work for the International Design Centre New York: two type-faces (Sans Serif + Serif), three colours (black, white, red), plus a grid - that's it.

Vignelli's employee Michael Bierut wrote "it seemed to me that the whole city of New York was a permanent Vignelli exhibition [around 1981]. To get to the the office, I rode in a subway with Vignelli designed signage, shared the sidewalk with people holding Vignelli-designed Bloomingdale's shopping bags, walked by St Peter's Church with its Vignelli-designed pipe organ visible throughout the window."







### Section 2. Italy > Part 3: Sottsass and Memphis

Known for founding the 1980s design collective Memphis, Ettore Sottsass made monumental contributions to design in every decade of his working life since starting his practice in the late 1940's, producing a provocative body of work that included architecture, furniture, industrial design, glass, ceramics, painting, photography and writing. As the Memphis movement in the 1980s attracted attention worldwide for its energy and flamboyance, Ettore Sottsass began assembling a major design consultancy, which he named Sottsass Associati. The books and catalogues in the collection span the years 1965 -2003.

"I have tried as best as I can to gather together the terms of a new vitality and, where and how I was able, to collect the shapes, colours and symbols that could represent the change in the images of this century from an intellectual organization to a reality that must be lived, to a kind of pure and vital energy." (E. S.)

## <u>Section 2. Italy</u> > Part 4: Radical Architecture

Radical Architecture was an experimental movement that developed in the years 1960 - 1975. The London-based group Archigram were in many respects the springboard for this process of revision and refounding, adopting languages from media culture, cartoons and pop art, with a general will to demystify architecture in line with the characteristics of consumerism and the massification of the new urban reality. The approach had great influence on Italian experimentation, seen in the practices of Archizoom and Superstudio, which can themselves also be connected to the example set by Ettore Sottsass in the early 1960s.






#### Section 3. Postmodern Design

The section comprises exhibition catalogues, ephemera, and collection catalogues conceived as artist books by the influential postmodern designers, Ron Arad, Marc Newson and Shiro Kuramata. 









#### Section 5. Architecture & Miscellaneous Furniture Collections


The section mainly consists of the limited edition folios published by the AA, each on the work of a single architect. In addition to these are rare press kits relating to Frank Gehry designs, monographs on architects John Lautner and Alfred Roth, and ephemera relating to James Stirling's design for the Neue Staatsgalerie, Stuttgart.

American artist Donald Judd also worked as a designer and architect. He was careful to distinguish his design practice from his artwork, writing 'The configuration and the scale of art cannot be transposed into furniture and architecture. The intent of art is different from that of the latter, which must be functional...A work of art exists as itself; a chair exists as a chair itself.' The catalogues on offer here encompass retrospectives, solo exhibitions and monographs on his architectural writings.

The section also contains scarce collection catalogues from Comme Des Garcons (founded by Rei Kawakubo), which also encompassed furniture designs as extensions of the fittings inside the Comme des Garcons shop.








